#### OVERVIEW OF 2023 SEASON

Great first season of Go Games. We have a good cohort of players and our coaching team has shown great interest in improving coaching skills through participation in club coaching sessions and coaching courses. We came away from the Go Games with fairly balanced results in terms of wins/losses.

#### PLANS FOR THE 2024 SEASON

There is a huge appetite amongst the mentors to stream players and managing that process for Go Games at U9 level, while keeping the group cohesive and avoiding the complications that it sometimes entails will be the priority for the coming months. We would be keen to explore a 'soft streaming' route where the squads train together and players interchange frequently between teams as appropriate to their performance and team play. We are hoping to build a strong squad of players that continue to improve in their skill acquisition and demonstration on and off the pitch. We are also hoping to focus on team play and positive behaviour which are incredibly important as the boys mature.

Our coaching panel is made up of several relatively inexperienced coaches and many of those are already split across a number of other teams so it would be a priority for us to reach out to others in the club to continue to build skills of the coaches and ultimately improve the coaching available to the players (coaching committee, GPO, etc).

I would be very interested in exploring the option of 'buddying up' with the Féile boys this year for some sessions.

We have expressed an interest in the Gormanstown indoor hurling event in the New Year and we are open to attending other blitzes should the opportunity arise. If there are any contacts worth exploring in that regard, we would love to hear of them.

#### Overview of 2023 Season:

#### Structure

Moving into 2023 we took guidance from the club GPO, Naoise Waldron who recommended approaching our training sessions with 30 minutes Camogie & 30 minutes football. Rotating codes to start each week.

It was a little challenging at the start to manage the timings but thankfully with a large pool of mentors we were able to master the planning and executing of our drills for each code under this structure. The BENEFIT to our team is that all players are participating in both codes at all times

#### Focus

Our focus has been on FUN while at the same time developing the key skills relevant to U8 Players.

CAMOGIE: Striking left and right / jab lifting / blocking / tackling / soloing / pucing FOOTBALL: Kicking left and right / tackling / blocking / soloing / punt kick RUNNING: movement / turning / speed

We linked in with Mark White (player parent) who is a qualified Strength & Condition Coach and works with Basketball Ireland. Mark helped us to tweak our drills to ensure children are having fun but working at speed and the over all effect has been complete engagement for all our players. We see our role as coaches to create a fund and positive learning environment while following the principles of the Long Term Athlete Development Model (LTAD) Model

#### **Team Building**

We have focused on calling our players the "Fingallians Warriors" and through this they now see themselves as a unique and special group of brave girls who have all come together as an "army of brave and fearless" players of football and camogie. The resulting impact has been really positive. No child has been put off having received a knock or a bang while playing football or hurling.

We have organised a number of Sea Sessions during the summer when we carried out our training sessions on the beach. Both players and mentors have really enjoyed the experience and feedback has been very positive.

We have not had the need to cancel any training sessions or fixtures during 2023 and the resulting impact is that the players love playing in the run.









#### C.L.G. FINE GHALLAINN

At training all players rotate through all our mentor groups. At matches players are coached by different coaches each week while once a month parent coaches are afforded the opportunity to coach their daughter's team so that they can see how their children are progressing.

We have 6 teams identified within our group. These teams are not graded so each team has a mix of strong / medium / weak players. Teams have been reviewed on a number of occasions with players moved around to try and keep the teams at a level standard. We have 6 teams so we have entered 2 x 3 team groups in Camogie and LGFA. In order to keep connection for all players, we rotate teams not based solely on home and away but also on colour. So Red Yellow and Green may be together in one group this week, but Yellow Red and Black may be allocated together the following week. The thinking is that if we send the same groups out to matches on a weekly basis it may become devise to the positive team atmosphere that we have created.

In July of this year, we were offered the opportunity to nominate a team of players to travel down the country for a competition/go games blitz. As the opportunity was not available to all teams/players we decided not to participate. Competitive Blitz are not strictly forbidden for Go Games and we would like to see a Club Policy in place around this piece.

#### **Parent Engagement**

We have a positive relationship with our parent group. We post regular updates on our Whatsapp Group and this is an area we will keep working on and continue to develop.

#### Plan for 2024 Season:

Our goals for 2024 are as follows:

Continue to foster a fun learning environment for our players

Continue to foster a positive coaching and administrative teams – people working together in a positive manner for the benefit of our players

We will work to increase our membership – we have profiled our players and from this we know that St. Cronan's have not really engaged with our age group. We hope to remedy this in 2024 with the assistance of the Club GPO and through canvassing players. Continue to develop our skills, while supporting those who are still learning the basic skills – improving striking both sides / tacking / marking players / positional play
